Library Learning at Home – made possible by YOU!

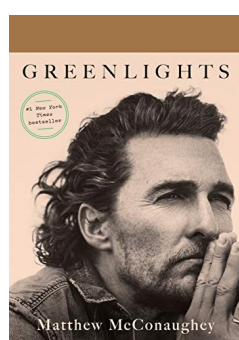

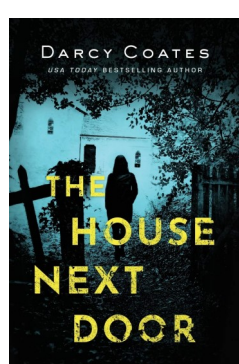
Greenlights by Matthew McConaughey

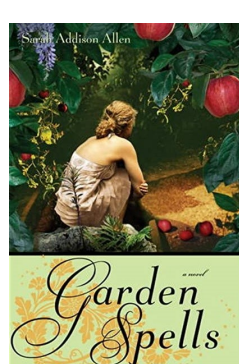
The House Next Door: A Ghost Story by Darcy Coates
